## General Instructions <br> **Please read all directions completely before beginning**

Welcome to Garden Medley. We are so excited you have decided to stitch with us. On this quilting journey we will be exploring simple appliqué leaves. Pieced blocks are adorned with easy pieced and appliquéd fans, beautiful leaves and embroidered flourishes.

I've had the thrill of working with RJR fabrics and the Hope Cove fabric line, by Robyn Pandolph.
We have included the layout and cutting directions for the background, borders and entire quilt. Assemble the quilt when all of the appliqué is finished.

Both spray starch and needle turn appliqué are fabulous methods. The pattern will work great with any preferred method you choose. The design needs no reversing for fusible appliqué.

Cut your appliqué blocks a bit bigger, if you have a tendency to appliqué with a tighter tension. Trim to fit to size after your appliqué is completed. If you are a beginner, a beginner appliqué class or good "howto" book will help get you started.

Be as accurate as you can when cutting your fabric. The entire pattern uses a $1 / 4$ " inch seam allowance throughout.

A window, some tape and sunny day can be used to transfer the appliqué and pattern to your fabric. Transfer your details with a fine point erasable marker or fabric pencil.

We are not pulling weeds, so be sure to not pull the thread too tight or it will create puckers in your fabric and distort the block.

## Block A

Cutting Instructions

## Block Construction

Note: We will be using rotary cutting instructions for the completion of blocks A\&B

## Fabric B (dark)

- Cut five $1-7 / 8$ " x 44 " strips.
- Sub-cut, ninety-two, $1-7 / 8 \times 1-7 / 8$ squares.
- Cut each square in half diagonally, creating 184 half square triangles.


## Fabric C (light)

- Cut five $1-7 / 8 "$ x 44 " strips.
- Sub-cut, ninety-two, $1-7 / 8 \times 1-7 / 8$ squares.
- Cut each square in half diagonally, creating 184 half square triangles.

1. Using the picture as a guide for block placement, sew together forty-six, 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" pinwheel blocks.

## Block Construction

Fabric E (dark)

- Cut four $1-1 / 2$ " x 44 " strips.
- Sub-cut, ninety-two, $1-1 / 2 \times 1-1 / 2$ squares.


## Fabric F (light)

- Cut four $1-1 / 2 "$ x 44 " strips.
- Sub-cut, ninety-two, $1-1 / 2 \times 1-1 / 2$ squares.

1. Using the picture as a guide for block placement, sew together forty-six, 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" four-patch blocks.

## Appliqué \& Cutting Instructions For 9 blocks

## Cutting Instructions

Background

## Fabric A

- Cut thirty-six, 7-1/2" x 7-1/2" squares.


## Fan Blades

## Fabric F

- Cut fifty-four, fan blades using template \#1.

Fabric B

- Cut fifty-four, fan blades using template \#1.


## Circle Center

## Fabric C

- Cut Nine, circles using template \#3.



## Block construction

1. Using a pencil or water soluble pen, mark the embroidery lines and appliqué placement onto your background blocks.
2. Working each 7-1/2 x 7-1/2 square separately, using the pictures as a guide for fabric placement. Piece the fan blades together and appliqué each 3 piece segment to the corner of your block.
3. Appliqué the leaves.
4. Complete the appliqué onto the top of your $7-1 / 2$ " background squares, for a total of thirty-six completed blocks.

## Embroidery

1. Work all of the embroidery with three strands of DMC floss, \#3346, in a back-stitch.

## Leaves

Fabric D (green)

- Cut 144 leaves.

Fabric H (pink)

- Cut 36 leaves.


## Quilt Construction

Note: there are a total of six complete borders, surrounding the center blocks.

All borders are attached In the long vertical style, top and bottom first and then left and right sides. See the cutting size chart for reference.

## Center Blocks

1. Piece together all nine blocks.

## Border\#1 (Small Inner border)

## Fabric I

1. Cut five $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times \mathrm{LOF}$ (length of fabric) strips, sew all strips together creating one long strip.
2. Cut two $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, attach to center.
3. Cut two $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 44-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, attach to center.

## Border \#2(four-patch \& pinwheels)

1. Piece together two strips of 22 , four-patch and pinwheel blocks, starting and ending with block B, a four-patch block. Attach to first border.
2. Piece together two strips of 24 , four-patch and pinwheel blocks, starting with block A, a four-patch block. Attach to first border.

## Border \#3

## Fabric I

1. Cut five $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times \mathrm{LOF}$ (length of fabric) strips, sew all strips together creating one long strip.
2. Cut two $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 48-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, attach to pinwheel border.
3. Cut two $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 50-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, attach to pinwheel border.

## Border \#4

## Fabric I

1. Cut six $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ LOF (length of fabric) strips, sew all strips together creating one long strip.

2. Cut two $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 50-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, pin and attach.
3. Cut two 5-1/2" $\times 60-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, pin and attach.

## Border \#5

## Fabric I

1. Cut six $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ LOF (length of fabric) strips, sew all strips together creating one long strip.
2. Cut two $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 60-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, attach border.
3. Cut two $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 62-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, attach border.

## Border \#6

## Fabric E

1. Cut six $2^{\prime \prime} \times$ LOF (length of fabric) strips, sew all strips together creating one long strip.
2. Cut two, 2" $\times 62-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, attach border.
3. Cut two, $2^{\prime \prime} \times 65-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, attach border.
